Executor/Personal Representative of An Estate



Who can be an Executor/ Personal Representative?

Someone named in the will. If the decedent's will names a person as the executor, that person is his first priority.

***If there is no will (intestate), the Court follows priority rules.**

When there is no will or the named executor cannot serve, the court appoints someone in this general order:


- surviving spouse
- surviving children
- other relatives (parents, siblings, etc.)

***Corporate Executors (A corporation like a trusts company or bank may also serve as the personal representative if legally authorized.**
